The Gathering Mission Statement

The Gathering experience will inspire young people to live the Gospel throughout their individual faith journeys.

The Gathering Vision Statement

The Gathering experience will inspire young people to live the Gospel throughout their individual faith journeys.

The Gathering will strive:

1. To provide an opportunity for youth and adults to encounter Jesus Christ our Lord and experience fellowship, growth, and fun in a Christian environment. The various activities of The Gathering will allow each participant to see Jesus and to grow in faith.
2. To be an inclusive fellowship of people. Activities are available to all participants.
3. To affirm and energize congregational groups to more active ministry in their home churches. To encourage communication and relationship building within youth groups, each youth group will meet together daily.
4. To encourage fellowship, which is an important part of The Gathering. Time for recreation, meals, and rest will allow the participants to meet new friends, renew and strengthen old friendships, and focus on their relationship with God.
5. To foster a sense of community by having participants meeting in small groups for Bible Study. The small groups will meet daily to explore the theme of The Gathering, study scriptures that are relevant to the theme, reflect on how it relates to all of our lives on a daily basis, and focus on devotional time.
6. To present skill shops that provide an opportunity to explore new ideas and interests within the body of Christ. Participants will attend skill shops scheduled over two days which will address special needs as well as general topics, all aimed at educating and equipping them for service to the Lord and enriching and deepening their walk of faith with Him.
7. To encourage full participation by all youth and adults. Youth and adults will be involved through planning, implementing and participating in all activities and encouraged to be Christ-like in all activities.
8. To celebrate our common belief and faith in Jesus Christ through worship. Worship will be held various times and The Gathering will close with a Celebration of the Eucharist.

2011 Rules & Guidelines

4

In order to ensure that The Gathering will benefit all participants and that property is respected, these are the standing rules for The Gathering.

1. Participants are defined as any youth or adult attending the Gathering. All participants will include these rules in their personal covenants.
2. Participants are expected to be fully involved in the event, shown by their attendance at ALL required sessions and at sessions of their choice, when optional.
3. As members of a Christian community, all participants will show concern toward other members of the community. This respect and concern will be extended to all hotel staff and other hotel guests.
4. Participants (except for designated staff and Covenant) will be quietly in their rooms by the scheduled curfew time. The City of Lansing has an 11 PM curfew. Students who need to move between hotels after that time, should two hotels be necessary, must be with an adult.
5. Participants are prohibited from the illegal use and/or possession of alcohol and drugs. Participants who are aware of such substance abuse or possession and do not report it to a responsible person will also be held in violation.
6. State law mandates that it is illegal for anyone under the age of 18 to smoke. Therefore, only persons of legal age may smoke and they are expected to have permission of their advisors. All gathering hotels are designated non-smoking for the Gathering and smoking should occur outside. The use of incense is not permitted.
7. With the exception of married couples, persons of the opposite sex that are visiting one another and are in the same hotel room must leave the door of that room open at least 24 inches (2 feet) and the lights must be on.
8. Upon arrival, each participant will acknowledge the condition of his or her room on the "Room Condition Form" and must turn this form in to Gathering Central. Any damages to the room or phone charges incurred will be charged to all residents of said room and will be paid before leaving the Gathering.
9. The Gathering Managers and Covenant/Team Leaders have the final responsibility in dealing with infractions of these rules. Infractions can and should be reported to either: Covenant, Youth Group Leaders, and always Managers.
10. There will be no talking on cell phones or listening to digital music players during any of the mandatory events. There will be no talking on cell phones or listening to digital music players during any of the mandatory events.
11. These rules have been added as a result of previous Gathering experiences: ABSOLUTELY NO: weapons or weapon like toys, throwing of anything in the hotel halls, hair dying, laser pens, moshing or stage diving, kitchen appliances from home, large stereo equipment (smaller personal systems are acceptable), video games and video gaming equipment—these items are forbidden to be brought to the Gathering.

Gathering Covenant

5

For the Gathering to be successful, we must come to some understanding of what it means to be in community. The term “covenant” is a dominant idea both in the Old and New Testaments by which community can receive meaning.

We offer the following statements as a way of giving the Gathering shape, purpose, and perspective.

We affirm that God claims us through grace and enables us to bind ourselves to others in a community which worships, learns, witnesses, serves, celebrates, and recreates together in a loving and kind way, through the power of the Holy Spirit who lives in us.

We affirm that communal life at The Gathering should be characterized by mutual respect for others and their property. We agree to full and enthusiastic participation in all activities, the willingness to risk meeting new people, and the offering of constructive insights to help The Gathering accomplish its goals. The goal is to honor and glorify God by bringing the good news of Jesus Christ to young people in a forum that is appealing to the youth of today while always honoring God and reflecting that we are filled with the Holy Spirit and desiring to be Christ-like.

We commit ourselves as individuals and as congregations to make The Gathering a meaningful experience and promise to abide by the rules of the event.

As community members, we will remind others, both youth and adults, of their responsibility to follow all the rules of The Gathering.

Gathering Manners

The Radisson Hotel will be our home for the next few days. Please give the staff your respect and cooperation in maintaining a clean, pleasant atmosphere. This includes your room!

On The Floor... We are living in community, one with another. Have respect for everyone on your floor; keep the noise down when others are trying to rest and relax. Have a good time but not at another person’s expense.

In the Small Groups... Let your Small Groups leaders be what they have been called to be rather than baby-sitters or police. When they talk, listen. When others are speaking, be polite and give them a chance before interrupting them. Also, BE ON TIME!!

In the Worship... Have fun! Learn! Discover something new each day! Have respect for those on stage and around you. Don’t talk or wander around. When you are asked to participate whether in singing or in something else — PARTICIPATE!!

Please be courteous with use of personal electronic devices during small groups, worship and congregational time - no personal texting.

The Honor System

Each year we face the same problem: whether or not someone is “guilty by association.”

If you have knowledge of someone breaking The Gathering rules and you do not report it, and the violation is reported or found out later, you will be considered responsible also and will receive the same discipline as the offender—usually this involves calling parents and asking them to come to Lansing and take their child home.

An example: You know that your roommates are drinking alcohol and you do not report it. They are caught and they tell security that you were involved or knew about it. YOU risk the same consequences as they do.

Who do you report to?

Your adult leader would be the first choice. We are aware, however, that some of you may feel awkward doing this, so feel free to contact one of our Peer Ministers to assist you. Of course, any member of the Gathering Covenant Team will also be available. DO NOT ALLOW SOMEONE ELSE TO RUIN YOUR TIME AT THE GATHERING!!!

Why an honor system?

The Gathering is a time for youth and adults to come together in a Christian community. Much volunteer time and church funds are expended to create this time together. Abuse of the rules and of the time at the event could endanger the very existence of the Gathering. WE ALL need to work TOGETHER to protect the integrity of the Gathering and see to it that this

By the time you read this, you may have already broken the rules and changed rooms. **PLEASE MOVE BACK!!** If you need a room change, please contact the registrar and we will work together. It is important, in case of emergencies, to know where you are roomed.

Room keys:

If you have lost your room key, your youth leader must accompany you to the front desk to obtain a replacement.

Wristbands:

Why are wristbands important?

- They are your ticket as participant. Admittance will be refused without one.
- For security purposes we need to identify outsiders who do not belong.

UH-OH! I lost my wristband! What ever shall I do?

- Find your adult leader.
- Take your leader to Gathering Central
- Pay \$15.00 to replace a lost wristband.
- Pay \$5.00 for a broken wristband (make sure to bring it with you).

Repaired OR taped wristbands are NOT acceptable!! Do not cut yours intending to tape it later!

- Wristbands will come off or be ruined in water.
- You may suffocate if you wear your wristband too long.
- Exceptions are made as long as you have a pretty smile.
- No one will ever know that you aren't wearing a wristband if you wear long sleeves.

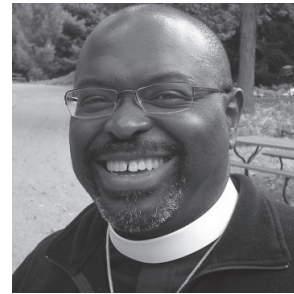
Items Needed:

Featured Musicians



The Spark was simply a small group of musicians filling a need for worship music within their local church in Kenosha, WI. As a by-product of the Living Light School of Worship Internship Program, they soon realized that their impact was as dynamic as their sound. Their debut full-length live album entitled "Your Love Is Strong," (released in August 2010) is a vital melding of new and old, fresh and familiar. The Spark tears the ribbon off the neatly packaged box that most contemporary Christian sound fits into. They explore the depth of worship that is only possible when the Word of God is sought honestly and humbly, something that front man Chris Marvin feels is the band's foundation. "I think there's great danger in writing songs for other people to sing while failing to stay true to their message on a personal level," he says.



Jetty Rae is a singer-songwriter based out of Ann Arbor Michigan, originally from Northern Michigan. Jetty has been singing, touring, and recording for the past five years. While living in Hawaii for two years, she became inspired and picked up the guitar. While in Hawaii, she also joined the rap and hip-hop group Soul Chronicle, and toured the Hawaiian Islands, as well as mainland China with them. With her first experiences in the studio under her belt, Jetty left the Independent hip-hop world for a more organic, folk sound.

Peer Ministry

Do you need a new friend, or someone to talk to? Maybe you are struggling with something going on in your life. Peer Ministers are youth who have been specially trained to help people deal with the struggles in our lives. These youth are trained to listen, resolve conflicts, help people talk about difficult issues, and be a welcoming, Christ-like presence.

Some reasons you may want to call for a Peer Minister are:

- 1) Someone needs a person to talk with,
- 2) There is a conflict in your youth group or room,
- 3) Someone is homesick, lonely, or overwhelmed,
- 4) You are dealing with significant faith questions,
- 5) You need someone to pray with you.

If you need a Peer Minister, watch for the youth and adults who will be wearing special t-shirts. They will be walking around throughout the Gathering. You can also visit Regency II (on the second floor outside the ballroom in the Radisson) or visit them at Gathering Central in The Lansing Center, during recreation times. We are here to serve, as Christ serves us.

Penny War Rules

Collection Method: Once again the penny offering will be at the Youth Gathering. Each represented class as a whole will compete against the other represented classes. Each represented class will have a designated collection bottle placed near the elevators on the 2nd floor of The Radisson. Individuals are encouraged to collect and deposit pennies into their represented class collection bottles from the beginning of the "Gathering" until the last night of the "Gathering".

Counting Measures: Individuals from rival represented classes may visit their "opponents" (any other represented class) and deposit coins (other than pennies) or bills. These count against the represented class and may only be overcome by increasing the total number of pennies collected there.

- Pennies = Each Penny **increases** the score by 1 point
- Nickels = Each Nickel **decreases** the score by 5 points
- Dimes = Each Dime **decreases** the score by 10 points
- Quarters = Each Quarter **decreases** the score by 25 points
- Dollars = Each Dollar **decreases** the score by 100 points

Rolled coins in proper tubes count an additional 10 points.

Tubes are available at any local Credit Union, Bank or from the penny offering committee.

Please note: Only U.S. currency will be counted!!!

The class that has the most positive points in its designated jar will win. All funds raised from this competition go towards the scholarship fund, which is used by youth to defray the cost of attending the Gathering. Start planning your strategy!

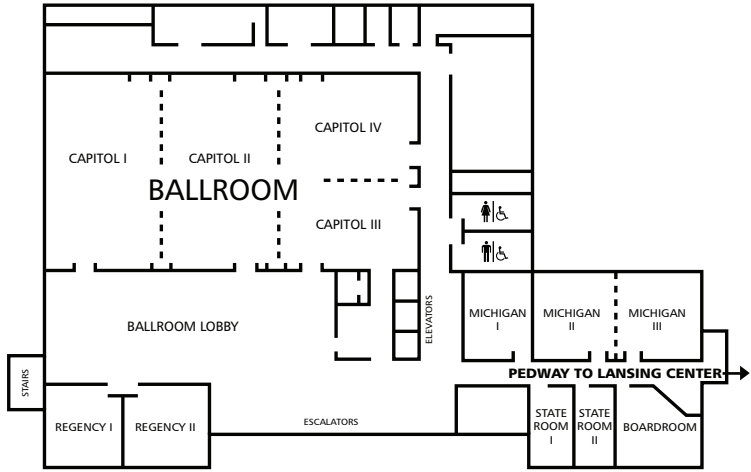

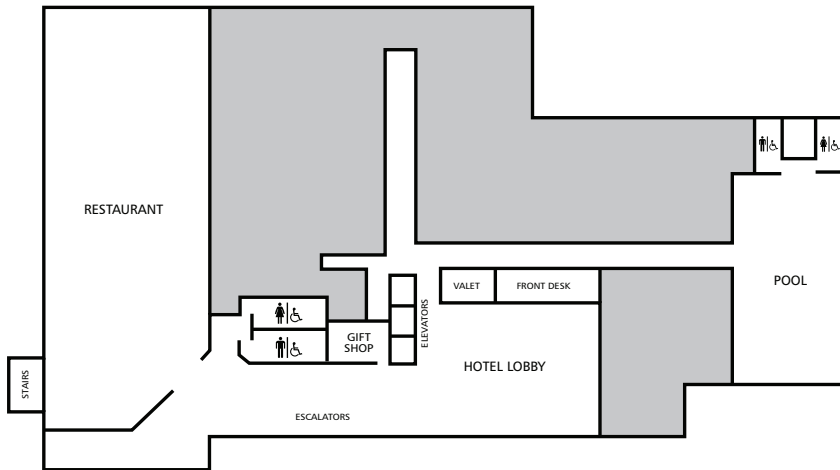

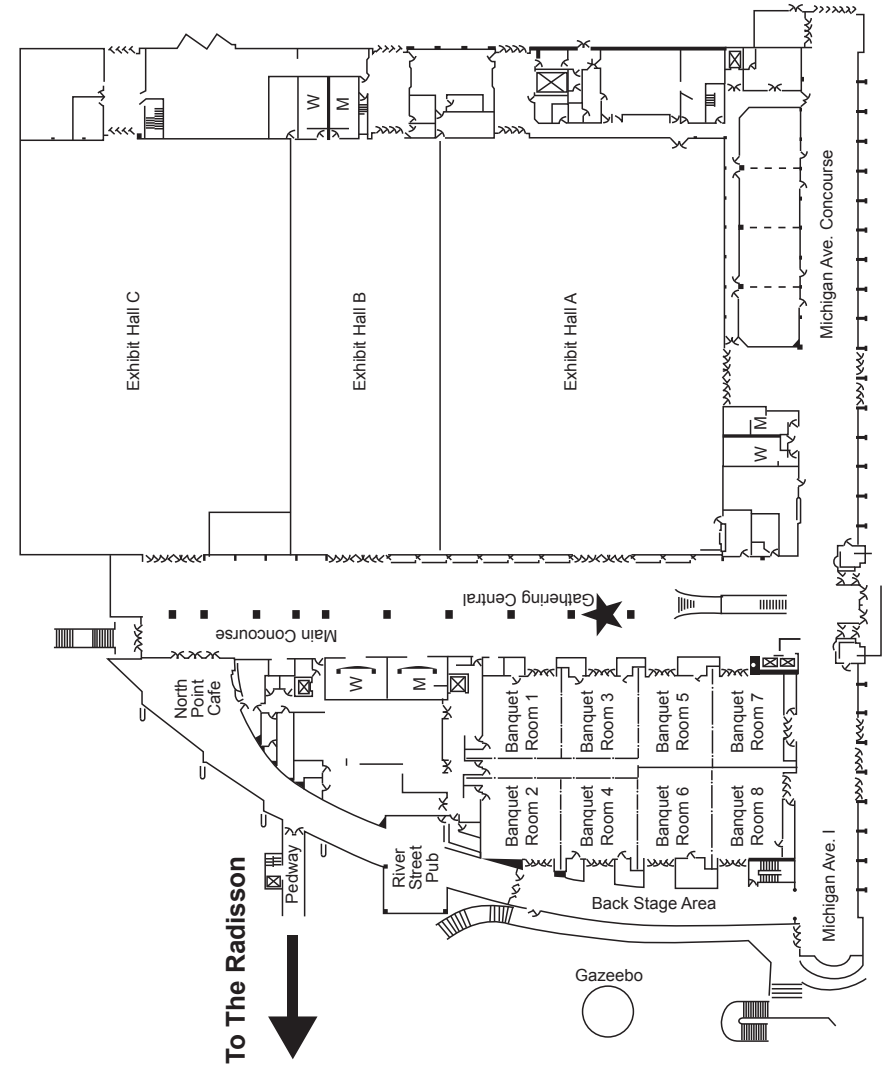
